KATE GILMORE This young artist enjoys being a girl, but she doesn't let it cramp her style. In videos and site-specific video installations that fuse process, performance, formalism and feminism, she kicks her way through monochrome walls (including two here) or reduces blocks of plaster to smithereens — but always in color-coordinated outfits, usually in heels and sometimes gloves. The work is focused and succinct, and it takes advantage of the artist's muscle in the way some earlier feminist artists sometimes exploited their looks. Brava.
